

Snowing in Bali is a rip snorting (pardon the pun) good read. A tale, probably true, of greed, arrogance and sometimes the getting of wisdom of a few of the organizers of the distribution of drugs, mostly cocaine. The stories of endemic corruption of the Indonesian legal system, some immigration officials and some police are alarming. The stories of the characters' experiences are intriguing. I personally hope these are exaggerated stories but even if half are true, it is still cause for concern. It is written in a form of interviews with the characters involved- I think the author is a journalist/ writer by profession.

After reading Hotel Korobokan, and being surprised by the depth of corruption within not only the prison system but extending all the way to the top of the judicial system, I was not surprised by the revelations contained in "Snowing in Bali". The book is well written and a real page turner, based on extensive interviews with the Bali drug barons. Even if you only believe half of what these drug lords say it still paints a sorry picture and would make me think twice about visiting a countries where many foreigners our seen as a source of untapped wealth waiting to be squeezed. Thoroughly great read!

I bought this book yesterday and have finished it already, which is a first for because I'm not much of a reader. But I loved it so much and could not put it down until I'd finished every word. I decided to buy this book after finishing Hotel K by the same author Kathryn Bonella. She has such a great writing style, and the descriptions make you feel like you are right there. You sit on the edge of your seat until the last page. Snowing in Bali is incredibly graphic too, the descriptions of the orgies are full on with direct quotes from the drug bosses.
