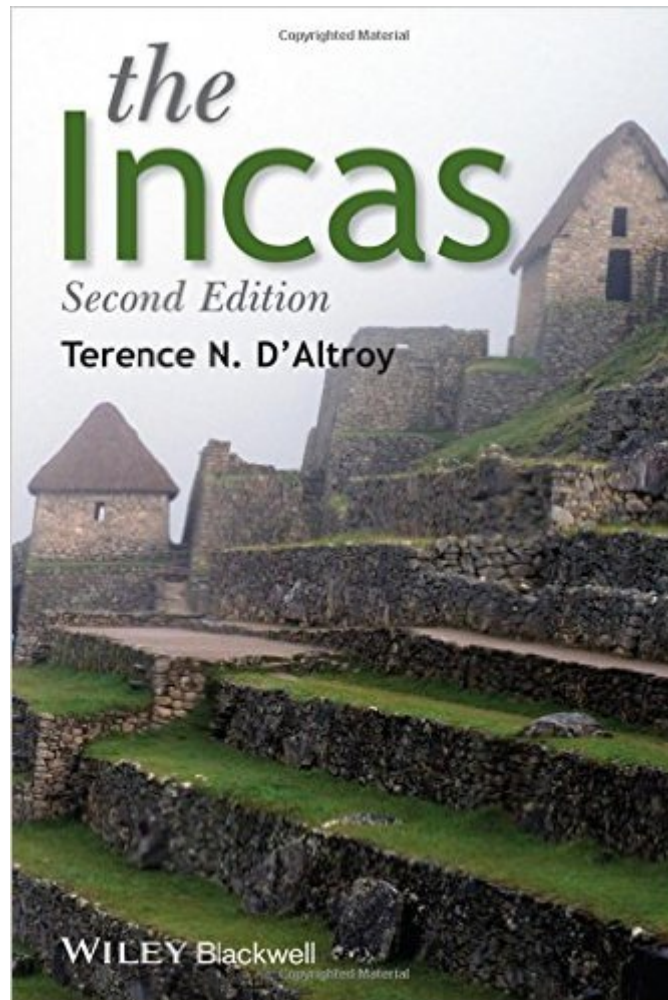

However, it has 475 pages of text that read like an encyclopedia, which is a bit more than I had in mind. It often references places for which there are no maps. I often could not really understand what in the world the author was talking about. If you are just beginning to study the Incas or researching a little bit before a trip, I would recommend another book. If you are a specialist in the Incas, of course, this book would be a must have. From reading this book, I have learned that our knowledge of the Incas is rapidly developing and
